Martingale Collars



What is a martingale collar?

Martingale collars are constructed using two separate loops. One big, adjustable loop, which you slip over your dog's head, and one smaller loop. Properly fitted, a martingale collar will be comfortably loose. When the martingale loop is pulled (like when your boston terrier goes after the rottweiler), the small shrinks and the adjustable loop tightens. Dog trainers often recommend the martingale to their clientele for the control it provides.

What size should I buy?

Grab a tape measure to determine neck circumference, then follow this guide:

- 8" - 11" = X-Small
- 10" - 15" = Small
- 14" - 23" = Medium/Large
- 19" - 27" = X-Large

If you can't measure, use our rough guide:

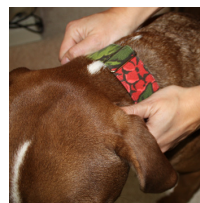
- Yorkie = X-Small
- Westie = Small
- Labrador = Medium/Large
- St. Bernard = X-Large

And don't worry - people rarely guess wrong. The sizes' neck circumferences overlap, so dogs can usually wear two or three different sizes.

How do I get the collar on my dog?



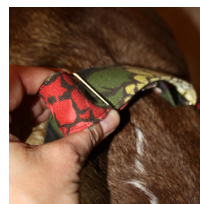
First, locate the adjustable slide on the large loop.



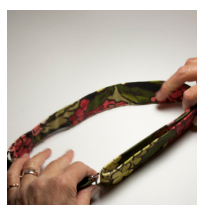
Slip the collar over your dog's head.



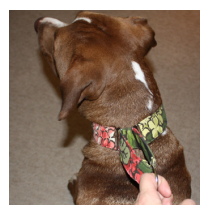
Now, you need to make the collar large enough to fit over your dog's head. Guide the collar through the slide.



Find the adjustable slide again and feed the collar through the slide in the opposite direction. Tighten the large loop until comfortably snug.



Pull the collar taut. It should now be large enough to fit over your dog's head.



Tug on the small loop to test the fit and you're ready to go!
